Everything else leads to narrowness and ultimately to loneliness.

In our Kolping Families and in our worldwide Association we practice again and again how to show solidarity, to be there for one another, to help each other. Not only within our Kolping Families and within our Association but with all people we meet. The child in the manger finally grows up to a human being who is not eager to acquire and possess things, who does not thirst for fame and recognition, but who offers service, love and companionship.

Based on the principles of Adolph Kolping and the gift of the Holy Night in our hearts, let us be confident about the upcoming months in the New Year, full of hope that we will soon be free from the constraints of the global pandemic and that we will be comforted for the losses and fears experienced in the past months.

Merry Christmas to you! May your Christmas this year bring you good luck, good health and the blessings of God who became human through his son. Let us follow his love together.

A Praeses Proclaims...

THIS ALONE IS REQUIRED

What a blessing to be writing you this year! It is with a sorrowful heart that we begin our Christmas reflection, because of the sadness that some of our members feel having lost loved ones due to this very virulent virus that has plagued our world for two years.

We do grieve for them and for us, and we do feel the loss. However, we also approach all things in life with our Christian faith that tells that this life on earth is a place of passage, and that we are here to work through, to accomplish, with God's help, our salvation. All our lives are in His hands, and we are led home in His way, a way that cares for all creatures, even the sparrow (see, Mt 10:28). How much more does he care for you and me! Our loved ones are now at rest and they await our return.

In the meantime, we live the life that God gives us each day--receiving another opportunity to do justice and walk humbly with our God:

He has shown you,
O man, what is good;
and what does the
Lord require of you
but to do justice,
and to love kindness,
and to walk humbly with your God?

(Mc 6:8, RSV)

This Christmas season is the time to put this admonition of the prophet Micah into practice.

To do justice is to give each person in our lives what they deserve. What a difference we can make in those people who may have suffered during these last two years. We can give them encouragement and emotional support. What was stripped away because of this virus, we can now restore to them by instilling hope and confidence, and a sense that the worst is over. We move forward, from this day, with faith.

We can also love kindness, and express this kindness very appropriately during the Christmas season by generously giving to others what they need from God. We can be God's Christmas helpers in fulfilling the needs of others, especially those who may be struggling financially this Christmas. We can help by providing items for their Christmas dinner; or if they are alone, perhaps have them join our family. If they have no gifts to exchange with their family,

we can purchase gifts. If they need some confidence and courage, or reassurance and peace, then we can invite them to Christmas Mass to receive the Prince of Peace Himself.

If we do all this, and we do it like the prophet Micah suggests—as servants walking humbly with our God, then truly this will be for each of us our very best Christmas, because we will be participating in the very life of our God—Jesus, the Christ!

Walking humbly with Him, we become the new apostles, the new evangelizers of our afraid and needy world. How blest are we to be chosen! Indeed, we are just following our founder's, Fr. Kolping's, example: we are humbling serving our God by serving one another.

New York Kolping faced many challenges in the "covid era" like everyone and we were happy to start getting a bit back to normal in the Summer and Fall of 2021. Our residence in the Bronx continues to serve an almost-full house despite the challenges our guests faced keeping up with the bills. On 88th Street in Manhattan, our primary market was overseas male students and interns. This pipeline pretty much dried up during the shutdowns of 2020. It inspired some creativity and our talented house manager and board of directors designated a special space for female guests. Our occupancy rates are ticking upwards helping us move our profit and loss statements to a better balance. Our third house - up on the Hudson River - was better suited to deal with the pandemic challenges

since we have so much outdoor space. Our New York Kolping Family marched in the 62nd annual Steuben Day German American Friendship Parade. Our President, Gerhard Schmitt,

It's always great fun to march up Fifth Avenue in NYC dressed in our Kolping colors and lederhosen and dirndls. Our youngest members ride bikes and scooters - a few ride in strollers. We look forward to coming together for a memorial Mass in November to remember all our deceased members, particularly those we lost in the past year - Bob Doyle, Norma Curtin, Joan Sartorius, Ed Stinson and Antonia Rehrl.

Kolping International's New General Praeses

Msgr. Christoph Huber is the new General Praeses of KOLPING INTERNATIONAL

(Cologne, 30-10-2021) During today's International Board of Directors' meeting of KOLPING INTERNATIONAL, which was held online due to the pandemic, 37 delegates from 29 countries elected Msgr. Christoph Huber (53) as the new General Praeses of KOLPING INTERNATIONAL with a large majority. We are all very happy that he has accepted the election and will already move to Cologne next week for his new task. He will preside over the International Executive Board and will lead the worldwide Association together with the International Executive Committee.

Christoph Huber was born in Bavaria (Germany), where he has been involved in the leadership of the Kolping Society in Munich and Freising since 2010, as well as being the Regional Praeses of the Kolping Society of Bavaria. He is highly motivated for the step into the international Kolping arena and into the One World work: "It is a joy and an honour for me to serve the Kolping brothers and Kolping sisters worldwide as General Praeses. In doing so I would like to focus on the value of community which I always experience at Kolping. We are Kolping – all of us together. I believe it must be the first goal to promote this. And from the community grows our effectiveness in projects and actions. If we stand

closely together worldwide, Adolph Kolping will lead us into a good future. I am convinced of that."

Msgr. Christoph Huber is thus the tenth successor of Adolph Kolping. The term of office is ten years, re-elections are possible. His official inauguration as General Praeses will take place on December 4, the Kolping Memorial Day, with a festive holy service in the Minorite Church in Cologne (broadcast live on domradio.de).

Former General Praeses, Msgr. Ottmar Dillenburger, congratulated him warmly on the successful election: "With Christoph Huber we have found an excellent successor for the office of General Praeses. I am convinced that he will fill the office authentically, with commitment and with joy." Ottmar Dillenburger did not run again for General Praeses after the expiration of his ten-year term. He is returning to his home diocese of Trier, where he has been appointed Senior Priest Counselor and Head of the Department of "Pastoral Care and Pastoral Personnel" in the Episcopal Vicariate General.

In addition to the election of the General Praeses, the International Board of Directors focused on two other personnel matters:

In the election of the General Secretary, Dr. Markus Demele was confirmed in his office for another six years by a large majority. "I am happy and grateful

to be able to continue to work for our international Association. The Church as a whole and each of the countries in which there are Kolping Families needs the energy and the sense for the common good. Adolph Kolping has charged us with both. KOLPING is growing worldwide and helps each and every individual in his or her personal growth. It is an honour for me to be able to participate in this", says the former and new General Secretary.

In addition, five further members were elected to the International Executive Board of KOLPING INTERNATIONAL. This Board remains unchanged in its composition: Manuel Hörmeyer (Kolping Society Germany), Erich Reischmann (KOLPING Switzerland), Paul Nguyen Huu Nghia Hiep (KOLPING Vietnam), Dancille Mujawamariya (KOLPING Rwanda) and Rufino Rodríguez (KOLPING Honduras) were confirmed in office for another four years.

The next International Board of Directors' meeting of KOLPING INTERNATIONAL is scheduled to take place in Cologne/Germany in 2023. Markus Demele: "We are relieved that we were able to hold today's meeting digitally across all continents. However, this is not a substitute for the lively exchange in personal togetherness. We pray and hope that regional, continental and also international meetings will soon be possible again."

Curriculum vitae Christoph Huber

Msgr. Christoph Huber was born in Reit im Winkl, Upper Bavaria, in 1967 and grew up there. After studying theology in Munich and a one-year internship in Zimbabwe, he was ordained priest in Freising in 1998. Huber then served as chaplain in the district of Erding (1998-2001), as parish priest in Munich-Feldmoching (2001-2007) and as regional parish priest of the southern region in the archdiocese of Munich and Freising (2007-2010). In 2010 he was elected Diocesan Praeses of the Kolping Society in Munich and Freising and Regional Praeses in Bavaria. In 2012 Pope Benedict XVI conferred on him the title of Monsignor.

The National Administrator Writes

They hope to repeat this next year.

As you are aware, the 43rd National Convention, being hosted by the Cincinnati Kolping Family, had again been postponed due to the pandemic. Please mark your calendars for September 9, 10, 11, 12, 2022 for

the convention. Your attendance and support for Cincinnati is extremely important.

In February we will again be starting our Lenten Project and continuing with Kolping Kenya. The National Board had approved continuing with Kolping Kenya for the next year until the convention, where it will again be on the agenda.

Finally, I would like to thank the following branch reporters and members for sending articles for the Banner during the year. I encourage all branches to appoint a member who can periodically send me articles on the events of your society.




