Repairs At The Center. We are having an unusually busy year at the Kolping Center. It was reported in our last Newsletter that we had to remove the siding on the rear of the building, do some repairs, and install new vinyl siding. This costly job was completed in March, and thanks to **Chris Gerage** for managing this.

The rear fire exit door, which served us for over 30 years, needed to be replaced with a new one. That job was completed at the beginning of August, this time **Bill Conte** handled things.

Our under-bar beverage cooler also gave us many years of service, but reached the point where it could no longer be repaired in May. We really need this unit in order to hold functions at the Center. Chris Gerage and Bill Conte investigated different scenarios – a totally new unit vs. rebuilding the old cooler. In the end we decided retain the box itself, replacing all the refrigeration elements. We also added custom-made interior shelving, which will make storing bottles and cans easier. We should now be ready for the fall season. A big thanks to **Chris Gerage** who found this contractor and supervised the work.
