# Kolping Kenya Lenten Project

As we approach another Lenten Season and the 2024 Kolping USA Lenten project for the benefit of our Kolping Brother's and Sister's in Kenya I wanted to highlight the results of our Lenten project this past year with Kolping Kenya. For 2023 Kolping USA raised \$18.535.00 for the Lenten project. As I mentioned in last year's report, Kenya has been suffering from drought conditions since 2020.

In response to the drought conditions recently experienced in Kenya we discussed at the National Convention



in September 2022 ways in which we could further support and protect our investment in the goat project. It was determined that we should pivot the Lenten Goat Project to focus on addressing the shortage of water. Kolping Kenya is doing this by providing water collection tanks to the membership that are filled from rainwater collected from the roof and focusing on multi - story container gardens that are more efficient from a water perspective. In this way we would be able



to provide a solution for watering the goats, but also provide a source of water for plant irrigation and a source of water for the family as most families in rural locations rely on local wells for their water source and have to carry water home from the wells on foot.

The cost of a 5,000 liter (1,320 gallons) water tank is approximately \$335. The cost of a multi-story container garden which are made from waste plastic is estimated at \$20.50 per set. So far, a little over \$8,000 of the proceeds from the 2023 Lenten Project have been spent on the distribution of 30 water tanks to the Miambani Parish area of Kenva where there are 7 Kolping Families. Miambani Parish is approximately 125 miles east and a 4-hour car ride form

### St. Charles, Missouri September 6-8, 2024

The National Kolping Society is excited to host the 44th National Kolping Convention in St. Charles, Missouri's first State capital. This location was chosen to honor our first Kolping family, founded in St. Louis in 1856. Unlike former conventions, this one is hosted by our National Kolping Society and is only possible due to the work of Kolping members around the country.

We are fortunate to have booked the Embassy Suites in St. Charles, with room rates of \$170/night, with a 2-night minimum stay (taxes not included.). This venue is located approximately 10 miles from the St. Louis airport, a quick 15 minute drive.

Registration cost will be \$200/person and \$100/ family member under 16 years of age.


