She was an active in activities since childhood, and a very dedicated Kolping member. Most notably, she was our Brooklyn Kolping president for over 20 years. She had a dry sense of humor, loved old movies and the NY Mets, and was a very social person who was always open to making new friends. Steve Wenzler, 93. and another Brooklyn Kolping legend, passed away on July 26. Steve was also a Brooklyn Kolping member for over 70 years. Steve also served as our Brooklyn President for many years starting in the 1970's; he helped to guide us from the old Kolping House to the Kolping Center, and later helped us recover from two fires at the Center in the 1980's, then served as house manager after that. He never stopped caring, and as he slowed down he tried to come to a Kolping function when possible. We last saw him at the 2018 Christmas Party. He moved to an assisted living facility in 2019 and was doing very well there, passing somewhat unexpectedly. *Our sincere condolences go to his family, especially his daughters Terri, Barbara and Diane.*

Anne Novotny's family has had a year of both joy and sorrow. In September Anne became a great-grandma for the first time when her grandson Patrick and his wife Kelly gave birth to their first child, Madisen. He graduated from Regis, Fordham and then went to get his medical degree from Georgetown University. He worked at Kings County Medical Center in the Pulmonary Department. He was a professor at Long Island University and director of the respiration therapy department at Kings County until he retired. Prior to working in the hospital he served his country as a Captain in the army in Vietnam. He was awarded the Bronze Star and the Combat Medal. He also volunteered as the organist for*

With so many people out of work right now Father Chris saw a need to give the Holy Child Jesus food pantry a financial boost to help his parishioners in need. To that end he challenged himself to a 150 mile bike ride from Richmond Hill to East Hampton, Long Island. He found people to sponsor his effort by making donations to the food pantry. This was quite an undertaking in the summer heat, and we admire and congratulate Father Chris! When this crisis is over we will count on him to give us the energy and enthusiasm to jump start our Kolping Society so it is there for the next generation.

Local Food Pantries. Our adopted charity project of the past few years has been to support St. Matthias' social outreach programs which include a parish food pantry and a daytime program for the homeless. Those who attend our meetings know the NYC Department of Buildings reviewed our Public Assembly plan and required us to reduce the usable floor space with permanent fixtures which had to be put in place. Chris did the legwork for us by setting up appointments with contractors and being at the Center. Our small committee selected a contractor, then Chris was there on a daily basis for the installation started. We now have three built-ins in the main hall: a long counter and storage unit in the front right side of the hall *(behind the Myrtle Avenue staircase),* a display cabinet in the coat room alcove, and, best of all, a built in buffet area in the corner adjacent to the kitchen. We still have more to do in the meeting room, but the biggest part of the project is out of the way. We really owe Chris a debt of thanks for giving us so much of his personal time when we needed it most, and we really appreciate it.
