Dear Kolping Members and Friends,

Where We Stand: When the last print letter went out in June, I honestly thought our old, normal life would soon resume. I did not foresee the Delta Covid Variant would affect so many, and that New York City would mandate additional conditions for indoor gatherings.

So here is where we are. We resumed in-person Board of Directors meetings in May. The Board decided in September that no outside parties take place until further notice. The NYC rules would make Kolping (not the host of the party) responsible that all guests are fully vaccinated. This is a lot to put on our volunteer members who work the parties, and the fines are quite substantial. We will, however, entertain requests for member parties, provided the member takes responsibility for all guests who attend.

We are taking the first steps to re-institute the Kolping Center as our 'clubhouse' with social gatherings centered around the bar (which now has barstools) for members, their families and friends to spend social time together. The next one is set for Friday, November 26. Kolping will provide soft drinks, but this is a BYOB so plan to bring your alcoholic beverage of choice. Some munchies will be provided, and we welcome any light snacks or desserts you might want to contribute to the buffet. Card and other games are encouraged!

Finally, due to covid and other factors, we decided not to hold our normal Christmas party at the Center. After much discussion and consideration, the Board opted for a more intimate dinner party, which will be held at Gottscheer Hall on Saturday, December 4 at 1PM. We will have a chance to spend quality time together in a quiet setting and start off the Christmas season with our Kolping friends. See the enclosed flyer for more details.

Veteran members will remember that this printed *Newsletter* used to come to you about once a month. Now you are getting a mailing from us about four times per year. For those who wonder what's going on, here's an explanation. **First**, our Corresponding Secretary position has remained unfilled since 2014. This officer would normally send communications to members; out of necessity I have been doing this. **Second**, times and technology change. We are using email to send out immediate news and updates. I know some of you don't have email, and we will continue less timely printed letters to keep you up to date. I suspect some members might have email, but have not provided us with an email address. *If you have not done so, please send your email address so you are included.* Third, the considerable expense to Kolping of postage, paper and most of all, the cost of making copies at places like Staples, Office Depot or the UPS Store.

The continuing Covid situation is taking a toll on organizations such as ours. Similar organizations are having social and financial strain right now when many people limit their social interaction, including New York Kolping and our friends at Gottscheer Hall. Please keep the survival of our Kolping Family and other deserving groups in your prayers, that we all may flourish once again when this is over and done with.
