Belated good wishes to all our readers for a great 2023. The last few years have been full of challenges, let's hope this is the year we see that trend turn around. While there is still a possibility we will get some snow this winter, it seems less likely with each passing day. Yes, it is nice to have a snowfall that makes everything look pretty once or twice a winter, but no one misses the inconvenience and dangerous conditions that a major snow brings to our area!

By the time you get this letter we will be in the Lenten Season. This is a good time to ask everyone to use the envelope tucked inside the February issue of our national publication, the *Kolping Banner*, and send in a donation to the **2023 Kolping National Lenten Project**. We are again supporting Kolping Kenya, where there has been a lack of rain. This year we are raising funds to pur-



chase water collection tanks to collect and store rainwater, and multi tiered gardening containers, which produce more crops using less water. Our national Kolping leaders have made it clear that the goal is for as many people as possible to participate. The amount of your donation is less important than being a part of this project.

Please note our **99th Annual Meeting** is coming up on *Saturday, March 25* at *5PM*. Your dues are payable at the meeting, and members will find their dues invoice accompanying this letter. A complimentary supper will be served, we will hold the meeting, then finish with dessert and coffee.
