We are all ready to celebrate the 100th Anniversary of the founding of our Kolping Family!

On Sunday, January 20, 1924 a meeting was held at the old Brooklyn Labor Lyceum to determine if there was interest in establishing a Kolping Society in the Diocese of Brooklyn. A few hours later the Brooklyn Kolping Family had been established, and the National Praeses, Father Schmidt, was named interim Praeses. Several weeks later Father George Metzger, pastor of Most Holy Trinity parish in Brooklyn, became our first official Praeses. We were based out of that parish until our Kolping House in Ridgewood was acquired with financial help and moral support of the New York Kolping Society. That

Kolping House truly became 'a home away from home' and social center; first for the immigrant men who resided there, and eventually for their families as well.

Our Board of Directors, plus a few local members, got together at the Kolping Center on Saturday, January 20 to toast this land-mark and enjoy lunch together prior to our January Board Meeting.

The big celebration is coming up on Saturday, April 27...you should have already found an invitation in your mailbox! Our special day will begin at 1:30PM with a 100th Anniversary Mass at St. Matthias Church in Ridgewood. A reception follows at 3PM nearby at Gottscheer Hall.
