Subsidizing annual tuition for low-income students; covering operating expenses for 5 new apartments housing women coming out of difficult circumstances; contributing to funds for meals at a food kitchen; upgrading technology; helping make sure City kids can have a retreat in the countryside – those are only a few of the ways our grant contributions will be used.

The Kolping Society's mission is to promote the development of the individual and the family by fostering a sense of belonging and friendship through our holistic programs of spiritual, educational, charitable, and social activities. In San Francisco our charitable efforts are focused on local schools and nonprofits which teach skills, provide support and allow individuals to live and work in community while also being self-sufficient.

This year we have allocated almost \$100,000 to this effort. This amount changes from year to year, as we retain funds for our own building reserve (and boy, have we needed them in recent years) and only use monies earned in interest and capital gains, thereby preserving our principal investments. We all can be very proud of this.

This year some of our Board members personally delivered checks to the recipients to congratulate them and put some faces to the our Kolping organization. It was a very rewarding experience.
