
WELCOME REGISTRATION AND RECEPTION


LENTEN PROJECT

Impact



The delegation voted to proceed with all four proposals, given some caveats and guidelines around a few, as follows:

- 1. We will put aside a small fund for the creation of a digital document repository, which will allow us to store key documents online and make these available to the National Kolping Board and Local Families, as appropriate. Examples of these include the National by-laws, Board roster, roles and responsibilities, membership lists, etc.
- 2. We will focus on leadership succession to ensure the National office will continue to operate should a Board member resign or no longer be able to fulfill his/her duties. The first step to this is to outline each Board members' responsibilities with timelines included where appropriate. Examples are tax filings, Board meeting schedules, etc...
- 3. Update and modernize the Kolping pamphlet/brochure to make it more relevant and accessible for all families. This will be available in a format that a local Family can download and distribute. A committee was formed to review current brochures and begin to develop a new one. If you are interested in joining this marketing/communications effort, please let your National Rep or Anna Stukenborg know.
- 4. Beginning January 2025, the National Banner will be published on a quarterly basis. Each Family will be taking a poll of its membership to understand who may like to receive this as a printed newsletter (vs. digital), to evaluate the feasibility of moving it to an electronic medium. We will continue to send hard copies to any member preferring it, but hope to move to a more digital publication over time.

International Report

Msgr Christopher Huber, who was appointed as General Praeses in October 2021, presented the International Report and provided delegates with an overview of the impact and major initiatives undertaken by Kolping International. Below are some key "take-aways":

- 1. Kolping International is one of the largest philanthropic organizations in the world, with over 400,000 members and 9,000 individual Kolping Families worldwide.
- 2. Their projects are based on the principle of "Help for Self-Help", offering programs to help people develop their talents and enable them to become self-reliant and to make a living in their home country.
- 3. The Kolping Society was able to take immediate actions in assisting members in the Ukraine at the very beginning (and still today) of the war, being the first NGO on the scene.
- 4. Kolping Myanmar expressed their wish for Kolping not to forget about them, as they live through a civil war, requested that Father Huber visit and asked to keep them in our prayers.
- 5. In Tanzania, Kolping applicants go through a year-long program learning how to raise livestock, manage soil moisture and create fertilizer an demonstrate their commitment to the values of Father Kolping, before becoming a member.
