As we approach another Lenten Season and the 2025 Kolping USA Lenten project for the benefit of our Kolping Brother's and Sister's in Kenya I wanted to highlight the results of our Lenten project this past year with Kolping Kenya. For 2024 Kolping USA raised \$21,700 for the Lenten project. As I mentioned in last year's report, Kenya continues to suffer from drought conditions and according to the United Nations, have been suffering through the worst water crisis in the last 40 years with millions of people not having access to a stable and safe water source.

For those who did not make it to the Convention this past September I wanted to highlight some of our results over the years:

As a result of your generosity our Lenten Project has had the following successes:

- Improved food security vegetables are grown in all seasons
- Better access to clean water for drinking, irrigation, kitchen use, gardens and animals.
- Opportunities for additional revenue sources.
- Enhanced interest in program enrollment and interest in Kolping
- Development of Self -Sufficient communities

The continued drought has provided additional challenges in the region and for our Lenten Project - these include:

- The drought necessitates "packaging" the goat program with a water tank program
- Drought conditions and the lack of water requires additional out of pocket expense for feed for the animals
- Manure production may be reduced due to feed and water shortages and garden impacts as a result of the drought.
- Large families are challenged to subsist with a standard vertical garden.

The cost of a 5,000 liter (1,320 gallons) water tank is approximately \$335. The cost of a multi-story container garden which are made from waste plastic is estimated at \$20.50 per set. Please know that the Kolping USA Lenten Project for Kenya makes a profound difference in the lives of the recipients. Please continue your generous support of this project for the 2024 Lenten Season.
