THE KOLPING SOCIETY OF San Francisco marked its 100th anniversary with a special celebration at the United Irish Cultural Center on October 18th. The milestone event brought together generations of members, many of whom are also active supporters of the UICC, reflecting the shared spirit of faith, family, and community that unites both organizations.

Founded on the principles of Blessed Adolph Kolping, the Kolping Society's mission is to promote the moral, social, and spiritual development of its members while encouraging service to the wider community. True to the guiding words of its founder—"The needs of the times will tell you what to do"—the Society continues to adapt and serve in meaningful ways.

From the Industrial Revolution to the age of AI (Artificial Intelligence) the teachings of Father Kolping continue to resonate today. His simple concept of creating a safe environment for young people to practice their faith, enhance their skills and develop lifelong relationships has grown from a few boarding houses in 1800 Germany to an international organization with over 400,000 members.

The concept "the needs of the time will tell you what to do" inspired a group of young tradesmen in 1925 to take action on the idea of (re) starting a Kolping Society in San Francisco. For many, the Kolping House has symbolized a "home away from home." A place where newcomers and long-time residents could get together, bring their families to celebrate the holidays and support one another, through good times and challenging ones.

We continue to honor Father Kolping's legacy through our social gathering, cultural traditions and philanthropic efforts – celebrating faith, friendship and the enduring spirit of community that has guided us for 100 years.
